Sexual Assault:

Sexual Assault is any unwanted sexual contact or attention achieved by force, threats, bribes, manipulation, pressure, tricks, or violence. It may be physical or non-physical and includes rape, incest, child molestation and sexual harassment. Sexual assault is a crime of violence, anger, power and control where sex is utilized as a weapon against the victim.

Rape is a form of sexual assault penetration without the victim's consent. It is not only a crime, it is a violent and explosive interruption in a person's life.

Suicide:

Suicide is a PERMANENT solution to a TEMPORARY problem. Although suicide is a frightening subject to many of us, it is a familiar thought to many others.

Warning Signs:

Repeated talk of death/Previous attempts

Making "Final arrangements"

Apathy, unhappiness and hopelessness

Dramatic change in behavior or appearance

Giving away valued possessions

A Significant; Death, Loss, or Failure

Withdrawal from family, friends or social activity

Suicide has no age, sex, ethnic or socio-economic limits. There are a number of emotional states and perceptions that are common to most suicidal persons.

General Crisis:

During a period of crisis a person's habits, coping patterns and defenses are suspended. It is vitally important to assist the person to clarify his/her own feelings that will help in making decisions to eventually resolve the crisis. What are the feelings that a person in crisis is likely to experience?

Anxiety-confusion, distortion, poor judgment, and immobilization of abilities to solve problems.

Helplessness-overwhelming emotions

Ineffective Coping-unable to solve own problems and to have to turn to someone else

Anger-towards someone else or with themselves

Ambivalence-mixed feelings about the situation
